

**SCHEDULE C**  
**Memorials in Churchyards**

**Part 1**

**Conditions to be met to Reasonable Satisfaction of Archdeacon to justify  
extension or addition to existing Memorial**

1. The width of the proposed extension is the same as the width of the base that it will abut,
2. The depth of the proposed extension shall be no more than 8” and no less than 6”,
3. The height of the proposed extension shall be the same as the height of the base to which it will abut,
4. Only one extension shall be allowed per memorial,
5. The top of the proposed extension shall be flush with the top of the base to which it abuts,
6. The proposed extension shall be constructed of the same stone and in the same colour as the base,
7. A new foundation shall be installed onto which the base and the proposed extension are cemented,
8. The new inscription lettering and design of the proposed extension shall be in a style which matches or is compatible with the inscription on the original memorial.

**Part 2**

**Memorials for Minors**

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Churchyard Regulations for the time being and from time to time applicable throughout the Diocese, the relevant Archdeacon may with regard to the death of a child aged 17 years or under at the date of death authorise the introduction of a gravestone, headstone or other memorial stone (“the memorial stone”) in respect of any grave of or memorial to such child which is smaller than permitted by such Churchyard Regulations and of such appearance and design as he or she shall think fitting and appropriate in all the circumstances provided that the memorial stone is not less than 10” (250mm) high, 12” (300mm) wide and 2” (50mm) thick.

Note: any particular case or cases may always be referred to the Chancellor.
