

A course for anyone seeking to know better how and where to serve God – at work or at Church.

- Begin to extend your gifts and explore what else might be possible for you
- Recognise and value different gifts and callings in others, and work together with them
- Recognise the joys, challenges and excitement in a variety of ministries - paid and unpaid and in the workplace
- Look at new possibilities for service
- Become more aware of your own spiritual needs and the love of God
- Begin to explore and understand the models of work and life which energise or drain you
- Begin to explore and understand the things which you will need to do in order to move forward in your journey of faith
- Meet people who are asking the same kinds of questions as you are

The Journey



Seeking the Way consists of three Saturdays with plenty of time to think and reflect in between. You will need to be able to attend every session and there will be some preparatory work between sessions.
